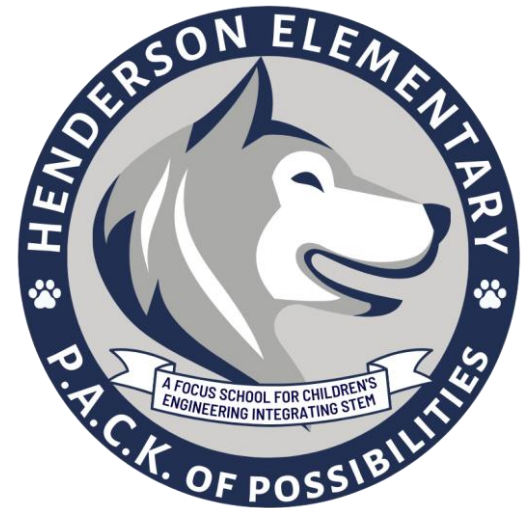

Essentials

Polite

1. If someone in the class wins a game or does something well, we will congratulate them.
2. If you win or do well at something, feel proud but remain humble. If you lose, remain calm.

4. When given a choice, always respond with yes, please or no, thank you.

Accountable

5. Leave your surroundings better than you found them. Be as organized as possible, everything has a place, return items to where they belong.
6. Students will be smart digital citizens.

7. While in the cafeteria, remain in your seat, raise your hand if you need help, speak quietly to your friends, clean up your trash, and respond respectfully to the cafeteria staff's directions.
8. When walking in the hallways, keep your arms at your sides, toes on tape, and move quickly but quietly. Remain in your place in line and keep up with your teacher.

9. Students concentrate on schoolwork during instructional time.
10. Students will follow the direction the first time it is given: quickly, carefully, and quietly.
11. Follow the same expectations with all staff members, including guest teachers.

12. When in the restroom, use the bathroom quietly to avoid disturbing the learning of other classes. Flush the toilet, wash your hands, throw away your paper towel, and return to class quickly.

13. To avoid disagreements and better understand other's feelings, students will use kind words to solve problems or ask an adult for help.
14. Students can control themselves when feeling upset so that behaviors do not affect the learning process of others.
